Growing Pains - James 1:2-4



There was a Minister in NYC who was born without arms. He tells of the experience of learning to put on his own clothes. He said his mother always would dress him. She fed him, dressed him, fed him, dressed him. One day, she put his clothes in the middle of the floor and said "dress yourself." He said, "I can't dress myself." She said, "You will have to dress yourself, I won't always be here to help you." I kicked, I screamed, I kicked, I screamed, I yelled at my mother "you don't love me."

Finally, he realized that if he was going to get any clothes on, he would have to put them on himself. After hours of struggle, he got the clothes on. He said it was not until later that he learned that his mother was in the next room crying.

I don't know if God is sometimes distant from us so we will grow in some way. I do know that sometimes we feel distance, absence. And normally it's because we, not He, moved. **But how do we manage those feelings of absence? How do we live with the experience of distance from God?** Also, how do we live in the midst of travail and suffering? What comes from suffering in our lives? What does suffering, challenge, discomfort, or travail bring forth in us? According to James 1:2 "whenever you face trials of many kinds, it tests your faith and

develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may become mature and complete..."

I am told that there is one species of birds of which the mother bird does everything she can to get her growing babies out of the nest. When she is ready for them to go and she knows that they can fly, she begins to push them out of the nest. On occasion, when a particular recalcitrant bird refuses to leave the nest, the mother does what a lot of human mothers ought to do when children refuse to grow up. **She actually begins to take the nest away.** Piece by piece she picks at the nest until it is completely dismantled. I can imagine a conversation going on between the child and the mother.

"Mother!" the small bird shouts. "What are you doing?"
"I am taking your nest away," she replies.
"Why are you doing that?"
"I put this nest up. I can take it down."




"But don't you love me?"

"Of course, I love you. But my love requires that you fly, and you can't fly sitting around in that nest all the time. So, I'm taking it away."

The small bird suddenly finds itself sitting in thin air and begins to flap its wings. As it flies upward, surprised by its ability, it calls back over its shoulder, "Hey, Mom. Look at me. I'm flying! I'm flying!" "Of course, you're flying," the mother says. "That's what the disappearing nest is all about."

Sometimes we're allowed to see the reason for our pain. But there are other times when we simply have to trust that God loves us and that He knows what He's doing. Do you remember the time Jesus washed the disciples' feet. Peter became irritated. He simply couldn't understand the Son of God washing anybody's feet. It ought to be the other way around, he thought. And then Jesus said, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but you will know after this" (John 13:7). Jesus was telling Peter to trust Him. God says that to us a lot. Our sufferings and adversities are often part of a greater plan, ultimately a good plan, which would likely be misunderstood even if God explained it to you. "We walk by faith, not by sight" 2 Corinthians 5:7. But because God loves us, and values us. He will sometimes allow the refining fire of adversity and suffering to shape us into better people than we would otherwise be. And we can stand strong and straight knowing that thru life's hurts the pearls of character are in formation within us. Praise Be to God!




Community Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service




Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and make a joyful noise unto him with psalms.




